

CONNECTING TO COLLECTIONS CARE 2018 USER SURVEY RESULTS

VOLUME I
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Introduction and Methodology

The Connecting to Collections Care (C2C Care) Online Community offers a variety of information resources and services for those in the museum, library, archives, conservation, and related fields. As part of its continuing efforts to address users' needs, C2C Care implemented the 2018 C2C Care User Survey. The major goals of the survey were to:

- Understand awareness of Connecting to Collections Care among cultural heritage professionals.
- Determine user satisfaction with the Connecting to Collections Care site structure and content
- Identify opportunities to improve the site structure.
- Identify future topics to present in workshop, webinar, and/or online courses.
- Measure the impact of Connecting to Collections Care.

The survey underwent a series of review/revision cycles to balance the need for a robust data collection platform with a manageable and efficient survey length. The final version of the survey instrument is provided in Appendix A.

The survey was fielded as an online form which was accessible beginning in early-July 2018. This report is based on the responses received by August 6, 2018. The survey form remained open past that date since one aspect of the survey was to allow those who are unfamiliar with C2C Care to request information about its resources and services.

A total of 1,703 individuals accessed the form. After removing substantially incomplete responses, duplicate responses, and the 20 individuals who were screened out of the survey due to their not being involved in the museum, library, archives, conservation, and related fields, the analysis sample consisted of 1,621 individuals. Responses by collection channel are summarized in the sidebar.

The full sample of 1,621 has an overall

margin of sampling error of plus/minus 2.4% at a 95% confidence level. Note, however, that some respondents (total of 226) were screened out of the survey early due to the fact that, while they were in the museum, library, archives, conservation or related fields, they were either not aware of C2C Care or have never used the community in any fashion. This leaves a "working" sample of 1,395 individuals. The margin of sampling error for the working sample is slightly greater: plus/minus 2.6% at a 95% confidence level. Even





within the working sample, not all questions were asked of all individuals, and not all respondents completed every question that was presented. Samples with fewer than 1,395 responses may have a greater margin of sampling error. The sample size is listed within each table in the report, and should be taken into account when interpreting the survey findings.

This report is structured as two volumes. Volume 1 (this volume) provide an analysis of the quantitative data collected. Volume 2 provides a listing of the responses to the openended questions. Both volumes provide significant insight into the survey sample, and should be used in combination with each other for best results.

Volume 1 is organized into the following major sections:

- **Segmentation Criteria** a synopsis of the major segmentation criteria used throughout the analysis.
- **Sample Profile** these tables address the demographics of the sample, such as age, work setting, years of experience, location and chief work responsibility areas/fields.
- Awareness of C2C Care these tables explore the overall awareness and usage of the C2C Care online community. Non-users are queried as to the reasons why they are non-users and their interest in learning more about the online community.
- Overarching Opinions of C2C Care these tables explore the overall value of C2C Care, the benefits received, and feedback regarding basic C2C Care usability metrics.
- **Discussion Forum Feedback** these tables center on the Discussion Forum, exploring usage, perceived value, and suggested improvements.
- **Webinars** these tables examine webinar preferences, webinar usage (both from C2C Care and other providers) and suggested improvements. The major component of this section is topic preferences, where the respondents provide feedback as to the topics of greatest interest for future webinars.
- **Appendix A: Survey Instrument** a hard copy rendition of the online survey form is provided.

Within each section, references are made to appropriate open-ended questions covered in Volume 2.



Segmentation Criteria

Listed below are the segmentation variables used throughout this report, and the counts for each of the categories within each variable. Two sets of counts are used:

- Full sample this is the full sample of respondents who are involved in the museum, library, archives, conservation or related fields.
- "Working" sample this encompasses only those respondents who have used the C2C Care online community. As noted in the Introduction, respondents who are unaware of C2C Care or who have never used it were asked a few follow-up questions, and were then exited from the survey. The "working" sample consists of respondents who were presented with the bulk of the survey questions.

Age

This is a traditional segmentation point, with the categories selected to best illuminate generational differences.

Experience

This is another traditional segmentation point, with the categories selected to take maximum advantage of the subsample sizes plus highlight "career growth" groupings. The data are based on years of experience in either a for-pay or volunteer role in the museum, library, archives, conservation, or related fields.

Institution size

Institution size is based on a self-categorization by having the respondents describe their institution as one that is "very small," "small," "medium-size," "large," or "very large." While this is not as precise as using a numeric metric such as budget or number of staff, it is a far more economical – and intuitive – method to delineate institution size.


