
- Attended the Alliance for Response Training in 2009

- Submitted an application for the State Hazard Mitigation Program Grant




- 1. Identify all Institutions within the County

- IMLS.gov Museums, Libraries, Historical & Tribal Organizations
 - See website for eligibility requirements.
- Hazard Mitigation Grants PDM, SHMP
 - Usually applied for by City or County with partnership of Museum/Library, etc.
 - Can be used for planning projects or mitigation work
