WASHINGTON, DC—Heavy rains and melting snow have led to flooding throughout the Midwest, affecting parts of the Missouri and Mississippi river basins. Communities in Nebraska, Iowa, and Wisconsin have been severely affected; those in neighboring states will likely see additional flooding in the coming days.
